#### Monday June 10th - LAKE CRUISE & CONG WALKING TOUR

A visit to The Old Steamers Quay and views of Lord Ardilaun's Obelisk are highlights. Departs at 11am and returns 12:15pm. Have lunch at the Crowe's Nest before we begin our walking tour (2pm) with Gerry Collins around this tranquil village and see some of the movie memorabilia in the Heritage Cottage. This was the setting for the famous movie "The Quiet Man" starring John Wayne and Maureen O'Hara. Join your fellow travelers for dinner tonight at Cullen's at the Cottage.

#### Tuesday June 11th - LISADELL HOUSE & MARKREE CASTLE

After breakfast we depart for Sligo and Lissadell House. Lissadell is famous as the childhood home of Constance Markievicz, her sister Eva Gore-Booth and her brother Josslyn Gore-Booth. Constance was one of the leaders of the 1916 Rising, and was the first woman to be elected to Dáil Eireann, where she served as Minister for Labour (thus becoming the first woman minister in a modern Western European democracy), and was also the first woman to be elected to the House of Commons at Westminster, London (where she declined to take her seat). Eva was a poet of distinction and an active suffragist, clashing with the young Winston Churchill over barmaids' rights in 1908. Josslyn created at Lissadell one of the premier horticultural estates in Europe. This horticultural enterprise has now been recreated at Lissadell. The great poet W. B. Yeats was friendly with the Gore Booth sisters and stayed at Lissadell in 1892 and 1893. Visit The Yeats Gallery Exhibition opened on 1st August 2010 by Canadian poet and songwriter Leonard Cohen. Continue onto to Markree Castle for our two night stay. Join your fellow travelers for dinner tonight.

After breakfast we take a boat cruise on beautiful Lough Gill. We'll sail around the Isle of Inishfree made famous by noted poet, William Butler Yeats where our Captain George will recite poetry by the famous poet. Teas/coffee and scones will be served on board. We'll view serene and tranquil waters against a backdrop of the sweeping Benbulben Mountain and the gorgeous scenery of County Sligo. In Dublin we say "Don't just sightsee, Explore!"... and there's no better way to explore Dublin city than on the famous green Hop on Hop off tour bus (included). Of course most visitors to Dublin city want to visit the big bus tour attractions like the Guinness Storehouse, Trinity College and the Book of Kells, Kilmainham Gaol, The Wax Museum and Dublin Zoo, but in Dublin we also like to show you the city's hidden gems like the Little Museum of Dublin, EPIC The Irish Emigration Museum, The Irish Rock and Roll Museum Experience, the Jeanie Johnston, Teeling Whiskey Distillery, Marsh's Library beside St. Patrick's Cathedral, and many more. Visit the Dublin Writers Museum. They occupy an original 18th-century house, which accommodates the museum rooms, library, gallery, and administration area. The Museum was established to promote interest, through its collection, displays and activities, in Irish literature as a whole and in the lives and works of individual Irish writers. Through its association with the Irish Writers' Centre it provides a link with living writers and the international literary scene. On a national level it acts as a centre, simultaneously pulling together the strands of Irish literature and complementing the smaller, more detailed museums devoted to individuals like James Joyce, George Bernard Shaw, William Butler Yeats and Patrick Pearse. It functions as a place where people can come from Dublin, Ireland and abroad to experience the phenomenon of Irish writing both as history and as actuality. The basement beneath both houses is occupied by the Chapter One Restaurant. After touring Dublin on your own, the group will visit the Dublin Writers Museum at (add time?) Dinner reserved at Chapter One for our group. (that needs clarification) Good cooking starts with good produce, and when you have the richness of the Irish larder to choose from there's an opportunity to really soar. Sunday June 16th - BLOOMSDAY FESTIVAL

After breakfast head to James Joyce Center to meet our guide who will take us around Dublin on foot following footsteps of Ulysses' character Leopold Bloom. Ulysses is often called the greatest novel in the English language. It also has a reputation as being one of the most difficult novels to read. Notorious for having been banned for obscenity when it was first published in 1922, Ulysses tells the story of one day in Dublin, and the meeting of two men, Stephen Dedalus and Leopold Bloom. It is, all at once, a kind of an encyclopedia, the chronicle of an ordinary day, the epic of the human body, and perhaps the greatest foregrounding in literature of the process of thinking. This tour explains the history and legacy of Ulysses. The walk features music, sculptures, murals, famous landmarks and readings and the experience is entertaining and fascinating for Joyce fans and the culturally curious. Dine on your own tonight and explore the local restaurants and pubs in this lively city.
